Emergency Services

When you approach a missing person in the field, what do you do? C/Lt Col Justin Holt taught an Emergency Services class that had cadets learning how to approach a scene, working with C/CMSgt Zachari Holt to communicate over radio, and learning from C/2dLt Matthew Carlton on how to communicate with aircraft in the air with signals. Throughout the night, an online Zoom call was also made available for the entire night, including Flight Times, which cadets learned how to better lead and perform drill. At the end of the night, C/Lt Col Justin Holt and distinguished guest C/Lt Col Reagan Hess (MO-110) were recognized for achieving the Carl Spaatz award, the pinnacle of the Cadet Program.
